Ward 5 is partnering with Wards 3 and 4 to canvass for the Coordinated Campaign on Saturday October 29. The launch spot in Bay Village. We can cover Bay Village and adjacent communities such as Back Bay.

We'd like to field a good-sized crew to do canvassing in New Hampshire on Saturday, October 22 with the Carpenter's Union. Mayor Wu, Maggie Hassan, and others. We're looking for people to drive and to carpool. It starts in Manchester at 10 am, so we'd need to leave Massachusetts at 8:30 am from Cheers. Return time will be about 2 pm.

We're organizing local stand outs. We'll probably do something at Beacon & Charles, and perhaps one in Back Bay/Copley Square.

We're also organizing canvassing opportunities for the Questions. Please contact the Chair if you're interested.

We're probably going to change our practice of standing out at the polls. Early voting has made this a less efficient way to encourage our voters. There weren't that many voters on election day.
