## **Meeting Minutes Review & Approval**

Noting that they had been carefully reviewed by him, Shari, Rob Whitney and Pat Amend, Bob Binney called for a vote to approve the January minutes, and then the February minutes. # **Key Upcoming Elections**

- -The Wisconsin Supreme Court election, and three special elections—two in Florida, and one in New York
- -Bob Binney: show support, with postcards, or in any other way

#### **Local and National Organizing**

- -The Boston Ward Dems Coalition in Action is being organized with Wards 5, 1, 4, 10, 11, 13, 15, 17, 19, and 21
- -Gretchen Bennett: there are many ways to get involved
- -Bob Binney: will send out more information and updates
- -Kate Gallivan: the Ides of March postcard campaign continues
- -The idea is to inundate the White House

#### **Guest Speakers**

#### Will Brownsberger, MA Senate President Pro Tempore

- -Asked members what they want to talk about
- -He's been hearing "make it stop"
- -Feels sanguine about protecting rights to the people of MA—but immigrants ...
- -Major concern: funds MA has will be drastically reduced–15% to 20% of the budget comes from the government
- -Support special election candidates, and help the Democrats win back Congress in 2026
- -Gretchen Bennett: are the MA House and Senate working together, now that there's a "common enemy"
- -Answer: The last session was rough, but most things got done, including bills on housing, climate, economic development, maternal health, liquor licenses
- -Pat Amend: his website, WillBrownsberger.com, very useful
- -Sharon Durkan: inspired her to start her Substack posts; thanks for being so accessible
- -Bob Binney: explain the position he took on the Mayor Wu's proposal to push a greater share of the city's property tax burden onto commercial owners
- -Sided with commercial real estate, not his constituents?
- -Answer: Like other cities, property tax assessment has been a "disaster" in Boston for 50 years
- -Little connection between valuations and assessments; politically powerful neighborhoods had lower assessments
- -Currently: residential properties assessed at 100% of valuation; businesses up to 175%
- -The state audits valuations every five years
- -Voted against the measure to stick with that model, as residents would see about a 9% increase

- -Cited two posts on his website
- -Bob Binney: what should Democrats be doing ... change the way they engage people?
- -Answer: There are some difficult issues where we need a course correction
- -One may be climate change; pursue it with less friction from high gas and electric bills
- -Abagail Gabrieli: concerned that people sell location data, with respect to those traveling out of state for reproductive and gender affirmative care
- -Sharon Durkan: as a City Councilor, she supports that protection
- -Answer: Historically, sociopaths and people with no empathy are voted in sometimes
- -Our job is to get them out of power
- -The larger group wants to work together and respect differences so we can get back on track
- -Kristen Mobilia: we need a clear message
- -People are hungry for one

# Sharon Durkan, City Councilor District 8

- -Signature season starts April 30
- -Thanked the committee for previous support
- -Serves as chair of the Council's committees on Planning, Development and Transportation, and COVID Recovery
- -She is running for reelection; asks for the committee's support, once again
- -Shared how she ended up on Fox & Friends, and had to report death threats to police
- -People like AOC and Representative Crocket, who are trying to shape our message, are dealing with this
- -There's a cost to speaking up
- -Community is especially important right now, when people lose their housing or assistance
